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GENERAL BUSINESS

Agenda Item No. 1 – Call To Order and Introductions

Dr. Waite called the meeting to order at 8:02 a.m. and introduced the newest Board member, Dr. Michael Hauer.

Agenda Item No. 2 – President's Report

Agenda Item No. 3 Executive Director's Report

- A. Dr. Peter Arvanitas - Review, discussion and possible action, including opening an investigation, regarding DUI disclosure.

Upon MOTION by Dr. Waite, second by Dr. Morrison the Board voted to TAKE NO ACTION. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

- B. Dr. Michael O'Connell - Review, discussion and possible action, including opening an investigation, regarding DUI disclosure.

Upon MOTION by Dr. Gradke, second by Dr. Cole the Board voted to TAKE NO ACTION. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

- C. Review, discussion and possible action on Five-year Review Report for AAC Title 4, Chapter 11, Articles 11, 12, 14, 15 and 18.

Upon MOTION and duly seconded the Board voted to forward the Five-year Review Report for AAC Title 4, Chapter 11, Articles 11, 12, 14, 15 and 18 to the Governor's Regulatory Review Council (GRRC). MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

- D. Review, discussion and possible action regarding the current requirements for Dental Assistant certification to expose radiographs:

- a. Review, discussion and possible action regarding the elimination of the requirements for a clinical examination.
- b. Review, discussion and possible action regarding the addition of a requirement to take a proficiency course for radiography.

Ms. Rita Perry, Dental Assisting Program Director for Phoenix College, addressed the Board. She believed the certification requirements which include passing both a written and clinical exam, demonstrate a level of competency for the dental assistant. If the clinical portion is removed, the demonstration of competency is removed also. While she supported the idea of the dental assistant paying less for the exam, she would like to see some kind of clinical training replace the clinical portion of the exam should it be removed from the requirement for certification.

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For informational purposes, the Board stated Arizona is only one of two states which require a clinical exam for radiography. Eleven states have no requirements and in some states, the dentists attest to competency of the assistant.

Ms. Nicole Albo, Dental Assisting Program Director for Rio Salado Community College addressed the Board. She believed the elimination of a clinical component would lessen the credence of dental assisting as a profession. She asked the Board to consider alternative options should it decide to restructure credentialing in Arizona.

The Board stated, at this time, dental assistants are not required to attend a course for certification. A person could potentially study at leisure and take the exam. However, the ability to take diagnostic radiographs is part of the dental assistant's profession. Removing the requirement of the clinical without requiring education would not ensure the diagnostic accuracy of the radiographs. It was believed that Arizona's requirements are the standard other states should be rising to instead of Arizona lowering its standards to conform to the other states.

Mr. Kevin Earle, Executive Director for the Arizona Dental Association (AzDA), stated the standards are inconsistent. AzDA members have stated there is a wide variability with the competency of the newly trained dental assistants. It would be helpful if a minimum level of competency and efficiency could be established and demonstrated prior to the issuance of a certificate in radiography. This way, the dentist would be assured upon hiring the dental assistant of his or her competency. The educational factor is important and some type of clinical proficiency should be confirmed.

The Board stated this issue originally arose as a result of most offices switching from traditional radiographs to digital radiographs. While reviewing the need to add digital radiography to the clinical exam, it was observed that Arizona was one of only two states who required a clinical exam. This was when the question arose as to the validity of a clinical exam at all. Additionally, the radiographs normally consisted of bitewings and periapicals, however, different types of radiographs are being used and it would be wise to include those as well. It was generally believed it would be helpful if a committee was formed who would look into this matter further and bring its results to the Board for its review. This matter was complicated and required a more thorough assessment than what the Board could provide at this time.

**The Board directed staff to establish a list of stakeholders and other pertinent persons to form a committee to review and determine whether elimination of the clinical exam was necessary and to establish the standards and need for proof of competency of the dental assistant. Information should be ready for the Board's review at its June 2010 meeting.

- E. Dr. Michael J. Snow - Review, discussion and possible action including opening an investigation and/or issuance of an interim order for a comprehensive psychological evaluation.

Mr. Tonner was present on behalf of Dr. Snow.

Staff informed the Board this matter was before them due to an anonymous report of erratic behavior by Dr. Snow which involved the police. The Snowflake Police Department was contacted and provided the Board with information for its review. Dr.

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Snow has also submitted information from his psychiatrist which states he is safe to practice dentistry; however, staff believed it would be beneficial to obtain more information in order for the Board to make an informed decision in this matter.

Upon MOTION by Ms. Bevers, second by Dr. Morrison the Board voted to OPEN AN INVESTIGATION for alleged medical impairment and directed staff to compile copies of Dr. Snow's reports for its review at the June 2010 Board meeting. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Agenda Item No. 4 – Assistant Attorney General's Report For Board Direction & Possible Action

Ms. Williams reported the Superior Court affirmed the Board's order in this matter.

- B. Dr. Mu-Hun Kim v. ASBDE (Case 280093) (Court Case LC2009-000370)
Discussion of Superior Court decision: Review, discussion and possible action regarding possible appeal of Superior Court decision.

This action was filed to answer the question of whether the Board could order an employee dentist to pay the entire restitution to a patient rather than the percentage he was paid. The ruling was surprising in that the Superior court did not affirm the Board's order.

At this point, Ms. Williams needed direction from the Board if it wanted to appeal the judge's decision. She informed the Board it is in the minority with regard to restitution. Most states do not award restitution due to the feeling it should be handled by the court system. The judge in this ruling believed the Board could just get the balance of the restitution from the business entity but, it is not that simple in quality of care cases.

The Board's options were to accept the judge's decision or appeal it. If the Board decided to accept the Board's decision, it will have an impact on future cases with the same circumstances. Another alternative would be to accept the judge's decision and not deal with the issue of restitution since it is a discretionary sanction. If the Board decides to appeal and loses, it would be liable for all court costs incurred.

Upon MOTION by Mr. Greer, second by Ms. Bevers the Board voted to go into EXECUTIVE SESSION for legal advice. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

RETURN TO OPEN MEETING

Board discussion ensued. It was generally felt the Board is in a unique position in that it does currently provide restitution to a patient as a sanction. It was unfair that a dentist who is employed by a business entity would only have to provide partial restitution, whereas a self-employed dentist would be responsible for the entire amount. The self-employed dentist usually only pays him/herself a percentage of the fee also; the remaining portion of the fee is dispersed for expenses. The Board preferred to appeal the Superior Court decision.

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Upon MOTION by Dr. Cole, second by Ms. Bevers the Board voted to direct its attorney to appeal the Superior Court decision in this matter. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

The letter submitted to the Board by Ms. Dotson's employer did not adequately document the hours, dates and times of work. The letter was not on any company letterhead, nor did it specifically state the name of the staffing agency, Dental for Staffing Service. Ms. Dotson stated the company was relatively small and was operated out of the person's home. She was willing to do what was necessary in order to become licensed in Arizona. She assured the Board that over the past two years, she has completed the required amount of hours.

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The Board wanted a statement or other documentation that would accurately reflect the 1000 hours.

Upon MOTION by Dr. Waite, second by Dr. Foster the Board voted to TABLE this matter pending a Comprehensive Request for Information; specifically verification of the 1000 hours required for licensure. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

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Dr. Anderson was present and clarified for the record he only had one DUI. The second DUI resulted in a dismissal. He was confused as to how Dr. Sucher came up with his findings.

The Board informed Dr. Anderson that it relies on the recommendation made by Dr. Sucher. Dr. Anderson would have an option to decline entrance into the program, but in doing so, the Board could also deny his request for licensure or issue the license with an order for entrance into the program.

Dr. Anderson was slightly annoyed that Dr. Sucher was not present to speak on this matter. In his conversation with Dr. Sucher, he was told that one DUI did not normally result in any action.

The Board was not sure if Dr. Sucher's recommendation was based on one or two DUI's. Based on the information that only one DUI should be considered, the Board preferred to wait on making a decision until after speaking with Dr. Sucher.

Upon MOTION by Dr. Waite, second by Dr. Foster the Board voted to TABLE this matter until the June 2010 meeting pending Dr. Sucher's appearance. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Dr. Frevent N. Millet**

Dr. Millet, his attorney Mr. Cummings and complainant RC and his wife MC were present.

MC stated her husband presented to Dr. Millet for the placement of crowns on teeth 29 and 30. Four hours after his treatment began; she was given a bill for over \$6000. RC ended up having two teeth extracted, root canals, a bridge and a bone graft. He continued to experience pain. They finally went to another dentist for a second opinion. The subsequent treating dentist told them the treatment was not done well.

Mr. Cummings stated the Investigative Interview (I.I.) panel only had a concern with record keeping and not with the quality of care. The panel also took the time to explain to the patient and his wife the issues Dr. Millet faced surrounding his treatment. Dr. Millet tried to satisfy the patient, but they chose to go to another dentist. With regard to record keeping, Dr. Millet had just converted to a digital, electronic form of documentation and was having difficulties retrieving records from it. Rather than sanction Dr. Millet, Mr. Cummings asked the Board to consider non-disciplinary CE in the area of record keeping.

In response to the Board, Dr. Millet stated he uses a program called LegalSoft. He still did not know how to retrieve the records.

Upon MOTION by Dr. Morrison, second by Ms. Bevers the Board voted to ACCEPT the Findings of Fact. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Upon MOTION by Dr. Morrison, second by Ms. Bevers the Board voted to impose NON-DISCIPLINARY CONTINUING EDUCATION of 3 hours in Risk Management and 3 hours in Record Keeping and Documentation with 6 months time to complete. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Dr. David Kloss**

Mr. Tonner, on behalf of Dr. Kloss and complainant TL were present.

TL provided the Board with additional information and radiographs for its review.

Mr. Tonner stated the patient was an 84-year-old alzheimer's patient. Dr. Kloss placed crowns on four teeth. Three of the teeth had to be extracted after 4, 6 and 17 months respectively. The panel had an issue with Dr. Kloss attempting to save the teeth in a patient of that age. Dr. Kloss was not in charge of billing, he's an associate dentist. Mr. Tonner assured the Board the patient would be reimbursed by Dr. Kloss. In return, he would like the Board to consider imposing non-disciplinary CE and eliminate the recommended record-keeping course which Dr. Kloss has already completed.

The Board also expressed a concern with the amount of work done on a person of such an advanced age.

Upon MOTION by Dr. Foster and duly seconded the Board voted to ACCEPT the Findings of Fact. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Upon MOTION by Dr. Foster, second by Ms. Bevers the Board voted to ACCEPT the Conclusions of Law and find a VIOLATION of A.R.S. §32-1201.21(n). MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
